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# **STEP 2** Now that a career plan has been developed, let's review and ensure your Little is on track to graduate with high school

Littles must successfully earn a minimum of **26** credits to graduate in Michigan and participate in required state testing. The course credits required to graduate include:

- Language arts: 4 credits (includes English 9 and American Literature)
- Math: 4 credits (includes Algebra, Geometry and Algebra II)
- Science: 3 credits (includes Biology; Physical Science or Physics; Chemistry, Environmental Science, Earth Science or an AP Science)
- Social studies: 3 credits (includes U.S. History, World History, Economics, and Gov't)
- Visual & Performing Arts: 1 credit
- Physical & Health Education: 1 credit
- Electives: 10 credits (includes Career/Technology, World Language, Child development, etc.)

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

SAT or ACT testing are usually not required for community college admission. However, they may require other testing and it is recommended to check online for the school's admission requirements.



Apply to at least 3 schools: one "dream" school, one "target" school, and one "safety" school

Use BBBS College Roadmaps to keep on track throughout the school year

Four-year colleges and universities usually require SAT or ACT testing for admission. However, due to COVID- 19, some schools may waive it and is highly recommended to check online the school's admission requirements.

Plan to take the <u>SAT</u> or <u>ACT</u> in the spring of junior year and again in the fall of senior year

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Complete the Free Application for Financial Student Aid (FAFSA) starting October 1st to be able to apply for financial aid and scholarships

Attend College Financial Aid Workshops and College Assistance Programs in the Fall to learn more about the financial aid process and get assistance.
